


INDUSTRIAL POTENTIAL SURVEY OF A&N ISLANDS

Foreword

It has been the endeavor of the A&N Administration to provide maximum support for the sustainable growth of the Micro and Small Scale Industries in A&N Islands. However the pace of growth of Micro and Small Scale industries has remain slow due to various constraints such as remoteness of the Islands, inadequate skilled man-power, lack of entrepreneurial initiative coupled with limited market & transportational bottleneck which has further been deteriorated due to the effect of Tsunami. Therefore, the responsibility of the Industries Department to motivate the educated unemployed youths to take up self-employment ventures is enormous.

The mandate of the District Industries Centre (DIC) is to promote industrial development in the Territory. Since there is only one District Industries Centre for the entire Territory its responsibility becomes more.

To prepare a sustainable Industrial Development Plan for the Territory certain basic data like availability of raw materials, demand for the products, availability of local market etc are absolutely necessary. The DIC has conducted Industrial Potential Survey in different Islands to collect & collate these data, and identified the activities most feasible for the respective Island.

I am sure this exercise will be very useful for the prospective entrepreneurs while taking up any self-employment ventures. This book contains a number of information indicating the Industrial Potentiality of various Islands & can be used as a reference materials by all concerned.

INTRODUCTION

Floating in splendid isolation, east of the Indian mainland is the archipelago of 572 emerald islands, islets and rocks known as Andaman and Nicobar Islands. This Union Territory stretches over a length of more than 700 kms. from North to South with 36 inhabited islands. Once a hill range extending from Burma (Myanmar) to Indonesia, these undulating islands are covered with dense forests and endless variety of exotic flora and fauna. The topography of the islands is hilly and abounds in evergreen forests. The sandy beaches on the edge of meandering coastline are fringed with coconut palms that sway to the rhythm of the sea. The sea around the islands offers excellent scope for adventure water sports. The rare flora and fauna, underwater marine life and corals, crystal clear water and mangrove-lined creeks, offer a dream-view of the rare gifts of nature. The clean roads as well as unpolluted fresh air attract any nature-lover, who seeks absolute peace and tranquility in the lap of Mother Nature.

OBJECTIVES

The main objectives of the survey are

- Social objective to assess the prospect and feasibility for the promotion of Micro enterprises to create self reliance amongst the persons especially the unemployed youths of Andaman & Nicobar Islands for a period of five years.
- The economic objective of providing financial assistance to the enterprises through government sponsored programme
- > The wider objective of creating self-employment opportunities to the eligible youths.



INVESTMENT OPPORTUNITIES

Taking into consideration the locally available raw materials and the demand, the following areas have been identified as major thrust areas which can be promoted in the area: -

- Agro and Food based industry
- Fisheries based industry
- > Animal Husbandry and allied activities
- Business activities
- Service and rural based industry

1. AGRO AND FOOD BASED INDUSTRY

In the entire Andaman and Nicobar islands the total available land for Agriculture is limited to 50000 ha i.e. 6% of the geographical area. No further land is being released because of the prevailing ecological conditions. There are 11 sale depots and 4 Plantation/Nurseries/Farms of the Agricultural Department. The major crops of the area are Rice, Vegetables, Spices and Fruits like Mango, Orange, and Pineapple. The Industries department has set up a Food Processing center for the promotion of food-based industries in the area. Training is being imparted in Pickle making, Jam and Jelly making, bakery products. There are enough opportunities for the promotion of these activities under Micro enterprises.

2. FISHERIES BASED INDUSTRY

The administration has identified Fisheries as one of thrust areas for the overall development of the islands. A detailed discussion was held with Shri.Tapan Kumar Chakraborty, AFDO. There are 987 Fishermen and 721 fish crafts operating at present in the area. There are 48 fish landing centers and during the season approximately 16 tons of fish such as Macral, Groupper, Kokari and Surmai and 6000 kgs of Prawn land on a monthly basis for about 4-5 months. However after the Tsunami it has come down by almost 50%. Fisheries related activities such as Pickling, Drying of Fish have good scope in the area.

3. <u>ANIMAL HUSBANDRY RELATED ACTIVITIES</u>

Apart from Agriculture and Fisheries, one of the major area under which Micro enterprises activities can be encouraged is the Animal Husbandry activity such as Piggery, Goatery, Duckery, Cattle & Poultry Farming. During the motivational programme many of the unemployed youths have come forward to take up these activities as a career. At present there are around 40 Poultry units, 14 Goatery and 3 Piggery units. There is sufficient scope for the promotion of this activity in different villages of North Andaman.

4. <u>BUSINESS AND SERVICE RELATED ACTIVITIES</u>

The Business and Service activities are the potential area for the unemployed youths to take up as a self-employment career. The activities such as Grocery, Stationery, General Stores, Pan/Tea shop, Cool bar, Cycle repairing, Umbrella repairing, Masonry work, Dhaba have good scope in the area.



DETAILS OF NON TIMBER FOREST PRODUCE (NTFP): AVAILABILITY OF BAMBOO (MAYABUNDER) AS PER WORKING PLAN PRESCRIPTION:

The Potential area for Bamboo harvesting available in Bajota (150 Ha), Mohanpura (310 Ha) and Karmatang (305 Ha). Bamboo is harvested at five year cutting cycle. Total potential area for bamboo in this division and area for annual cut available is 150 Ha. As per survey the harvestable bamboo per Ha is 750 Nos.

AVAILABILITY OF CANE (MAYABUNDER) AS PER WORKING PLAN PRESCRIPTION:

The total cane potential area is 133 Ha distributed in Bajota- 260 Ha, Mohanpura 540 Ha, and Karmatang 540 Ha. The total exploitable quanity is 937 rmt. The species wise availability o0f cane is as follows:

INVESTMENT OPPORTUNITIES

THRUST AREAS FOR INVESTMENT

On the basis of the local demand skill and availability of resources the following areas have been identified and thrust areas which have investment opportunities as given below –

1. AGRO BASED & FOOD PROCESSING INDUSTRY-

The local population is involved in carrying on agriculture and allied activities. The entire island is a Reserve Forest therefore there is limited scope of expanding primary agriculture activity, therefore down stream activities in the agro based and food processing industry has limited scope.

2. FOREST BASED INDUSTRY -

The island is rich in forest resources like timber and other minor forest produce. Non timber Forest Produce such as Cane and Bamboo are collected on the basis of the Working Plans recommended by the Central Empowered Committee of the Department of Forest and Environment, Andaman & Nicobar Administration. Therefore there exists scope for establishment of Cane Furniture, Cane Handicrafts, and Bamboo Articles making unit items.

3. FISHERIES BASED INDUSTRY -

The island has high floating population and they are the major consumer of fish. Presently due to non availability of ample storage the fishing activity as said earlier is limited to subsistence levels. But other sea foods like =Mud Crabs, Lobster etc are collected by the fishermen and exported to mainland. Infrastructure facilities like Storage Facilities, Ice Plant, Deep Freezers are required to be developed. In view of this an Ice Plant, Deep Freezer, Dry Fish processing, Inter Island Trading of fish, Export of Crabs & Lobsters, Fresh Water Fish Rearing has good scope.

4. ANIMAL HUSBANDRY RELATED ACTIVITY -

The forest cover natural resources for the livestock. Rearing of cows, Buffalo and goats are part of everyday life. There is good demand for chicken but poultry farming is yet to be done in a commercial basis. The demand is fulfilled by suppliers from Port Blair. Apart from Agriculture & Fisheries there is good scope for establishment of allied activities like Poultry Farming, Piggery, Goatry, Dairy Farming.

5. <u>RURAL ENGINEERING BASED INDUSTRY -</u>

The islands offers scope for Light Engineering Work Shop like – Welding / Fabrication Units, Steel / Aluminum Fabrication, Black Smithy, Mgf. Of Agricultural Implements, Repairing & Servicing of Motor Vehicles (LMV/2&3 Wheelers), Repair of Domestic Appliances, Electronic Shop, Tyre retreading & vulcanizing etc.







WATER SUPPLY IN SOUTH ANDAMAN

APWD supplies water to PBMC after due treatment and PBMC distributing water in Municipal localities. At present total water demand is met by Dhanikari & Jawahar Sarovar resources. The revival of Nayagaon and Chakergaon Dggies and revival of Dilthaman tank and Fire brigade tank have been competed. Construction of additional treatment unity at Lambaline, investigation and exempting of Rutland water supply scheme, development of Nayagaon, Chakergaon diggies are in process. Raising the height of Dhanikhari dam by 5 mtr. which will almost its capacity to double the present capacity awaiting sanction.

Power

The Electricity Department is operating and maintaining power generation transmission and distribution system in these Islands for providing electric power supply to the general public and various categories of consumers in different part of the Islands. The pr capita energy consumption in these Islands is around 280 KWH per person pr annum as against the national average of 350 KWH.

Due to geographical and topographical peculiarities of these Islands, including separation by sea over great distance, there is no simple power grid for all the electrified Islands and instead a power house caters independently to the power requirement of an area/ Island. The electricity installed capacity & generation in South Andaman is as follows:

Resources

<u>AGRICULTURE</u>

In Andaman & Nicobar Island the total available land for Agriculture is limited to 50,000 ha i.e. 6% of the total geographical area only. No further land is being released because of the prevailing ecological conditions. Due to rapid urbanization and growth of population in these Islands, arable land is shrinking while pressure on enhancing productivity is enormous. A strategy has been adopted to keep a balance among the various use of lands to increase production and productivity in a suitable manner and efforts are being made to produce more per unit area by adopting multiple and intensive cropping system following the suilific management practices with utmost care of conserving soil and water.

INVESTMENT OPPORTUNITIES

The potential survey in South Andaman area stretdes from Port Blair to Middle Strait and Neil, Havelock Island. The area covers 101 census villages of which 91 are Revenue villages, 95 are inhabited villages and 6 are uninhabited villages. Prior to Tsunami which occurred on 26-12-2004 the economy of all the villages were mainly an agricultural economy combined with Plantation and Horticulture. The main surplus agricultural produce are paddy, pulses, spices, fruits and vegetables. Due to this devastation almost all the areas in South Andaman including Neil and Havelock have been affected. Almost all the agricultural lands are submerged under water and is not fit for cultivation. There is a need to restore the livelihood measures and revive the economic activities in the affected areas. On the basis of the resources availability, skills, scope and local demand, the following areas have been identified as the potential and thrust areas which have investment opportunities.

These sectors are identified as thrust areas for investment opportunities:

1. AGRO BASED & FOOD PROCESSING INDUSTRY-

Based on demand and availability of resources, there is a scope to establish Bakery, Flour Mill, Jam, Jelly, Pickles, Rice Milling, Banana powder, Banana Yarn/ fibre, coconut charcoal, Mfg. of Arecanut leaf cup & plates, copra processing, Coir fibre, twisted coir and coir rope, coconut oil, production of organic manure, Mineral water, Spices processing, Ice cream, Mfg. of Poultry feed have good potential in the area.

2. <u>FOREST BASED INDUSTRY -</u>

Though the Island is endowed with Forest resource but due to the fragile ecosystem and in view of the Hon'ble Supreme Court's decisions, ban has been imposed on timber extraction from the forest. However the areas in Middle Strait and Jirkatang is rich in forest resources i.e. Minor Forest Produce like cane, bamboo and Dhup. There exists good scope for making cane furniture, cane handicrafts and decorative items, Hockey stick handles and cricket bat handles, bamboo baskets, mats, coconut timber furniture and bamboo handicrafts etc.

3. FISHERIES BASED INDUSTRY -

A&N islands has 1900 Kms of coastline and EEZ of 6.00 lakhs sq. kms, which amount to 30% of the EEZ of the country. Marine fishery potential of the Islands is estimated at about 2.44 lakhs MT per annum Tuna contributes to 75% of the total potential. Reef fishes are one of the most important resources of the Islands. Amongst shell fishes, edible oysters, black lip oysters, shrimp, crabs, lobsters are other resources. Apart from this, resources like sea urchins, seaweed and ornamental molluscs are also found in abundance. Major catch among the pelagic group consists of Sardine, Mackerels and Anchovies. South Andaman coastline area is endowed with rich Marine resources. Most of the fishing communities are concentrated in Wandoor, Chidiyatapu, Tirur and Bambooflat/ Hope Town areas. There is a lot of potential in the marines/ fisheries based industry. The areas identified for marine fisheries are export of frozen fish, dry fish, export of live groupers, canning of Tuna fish, processing of fish, dry fish processing, fish pickling, extraction of Shark liver oil, preparation of fish meal, export of Shark fins and processed frozen prawns etc.

4. <u>MARINE BASED INDUSTRY -</u>

A&N Island formulated shell fishing rules for rational exploitation on sustainable basis. Accordingly specific areas in these Islands have been identified for collection of shell. There are 9 zones for collection of shells. A particular zone is left undisturbed for a period of 2 years for rejuvenation. 20MT per zone per season is the potential availability of shells. A maximum of 3 zones can be permitted for collection of shells in a particular year. Under schedule –I, 9 species and in Schedule –IV, 6 species have been banned for fishing. There is a vast scope for developing innovative desires of shell handicrafts and souvenirs, aesthetic designs jewellery and shell buttons.

5. <u>ANIMAL HUSBANDRY RELATED ACTIVITY -</u>

These exists good scope for promotion and setting up of allied activities like Poultry, Farming, Piggery, Goatery, Dairy, Hatchery, Duckery and Quail Farming.

6. <u>RURAL ENGINEERING BASED INDUSTRY -</u>

The post Tsunami scenario in the Islands offers scope for light engineering workshop like- Welding/ fabrication units, steel/ Aluminum fabrication, Blacksmithy, Mfg. of Agricultural Implements, repairing & servicing of Motor vehicles (LMV/ 2 & 3 Wheelers), Repair of Domestic Appliance, Electronic Items & stone crushing units etc.

7. <u>BUSINESS RELATED ACTIVITIES -</u>

Besides Agriculture and fisheries, small trade and business related activities were severely affected due to Tsunami. The small trade and business activity which have good scope are Grocery, Stationery, General Stores, Cloth Shop, Pharmacy, Shoe shop, Sweet shop, Ice Cream Parlour, Beauty Parlour, Restaurants, Dhaba, Hotels etc.

8. <u>TOURISM RELATED ACTIVITY -</u>

Due to the rise in the inflow of domestic and international tourists every year there is a need to develop infrastructure and related services for tourism promotion development. The activities like organized conducted tours & travels, setting up of a dhaba, restaurant, plying of boats, hiring of scuba diving equipments, souvenir shops, setting up of beach umbrellas, spas etc has demand.



INVESTMENT OPPORTUNITIES

THRUST AREAS FOR INVESTMENT

On the basis of the local demand skill and availability of resources the following areas have been identified as thrust areas which have investment opportunities as given below –

2. AGRO BASED & FOOD PROCESSING INDUSTRY-

There are 19 Census Villages in Little Andaman of which 5 are Revenue Villages, 4 are Tribal Settlements and the remaining 10 are Forest Camps. Prior to Tsunami which occurred on 26th Dec 04 the economy of the village was dependent mostly on agriculture related activities. Due to this devastation 10 Hect. at Harmindar Bay, 20 Hect. at John Richardson Bay (Chota Basthi), 87 Hect. at Netaji Nagar and 20 Hect. at Dugong Creek have been affected. All these areas have been restored. Based on demand and availability of resources there is scope to establish Bakery, Flour Mill, Coir Rope, Rubber Sheet, Copra Processing, Broom Sticks etc.

2. <u>FOREST BASED INDUSTRY -</u>

The island is rich in forest resources like timber and other minor forest produce. However in view of the availability of Cane and Drift Wood in the islands there exists scope for establishment of Cane Furniture, Cane Handicrafts, and Tribal Handicrafts & Drift Wood Items.

3. <u>FISHERS BASED INDUSTRY -</u>

The island is endowed with rich Marine Resources. Most of the fishing community is Tribes of Nancowry group of Islands. Now due to the intervention / assistance of NGO's like 'Aparajita', CARE and active participation of the Fisheries Dept the fishermen community has receive approximately 58 motor driven boats till date. In order to store and supply the fish to nearby market the infrastructural support such as Cold Storage Facilities, Ice Plant, Deep Freezers are required to be developed. In view of this an Ice Plant, Deep Freezer, Dry Fish processing, Inter Island Trading of fish, Export of Crabs & Lobsters, Fresh Water Fish Rearing has good scope.

4. <u>ANIMAL HUSBANDRY RELATED ACTIVITY -</u>

Apart from Agriculture & Fisheries there is good scope or establishment of allied activities like Poultry Farming, Piggery, Goatry, Dairy Farming. According to the reports collected the livestock loss in Little Andaman Island is 397 Cattle, 503 Pigs, 1146 Goats & 9119 Poultry.

5. <u>RURAL ENGINEERING BASED INDUSTRY -</u>

6. <u>BUSINESS RELATED ACTIVITIES -</u>

Besides Fisheries & Agriculture Small Trade & Business Related activities were severely affected due to Tsunami. The small trade and business activity which have good scope are Grocery, Stationery, General Stores, Cloth Shop, Fast food, Tailoring, Cobbler shop, Laundry shop, Barber Shop, Cycle repairing shop, Shoe Shop, Pharmacy etc..

PROSPECTS & FEASIBILITY OF ESTABLISHMENT OF MICRO ENTERPRISES

Due to the tsunami the coastal areas of Little Andaman has been affected and they need to have rehabilitated. In the process of rehabilitating the affected, initially the affected are being kept in Temporary Shelters located at different points in the Island. They shall latter be shifted to Permanent Shelter that are yet to be constructed.

From the above we can infer that the new location for the proposed Permanent Shelter. Since the entire market area of Hut bay has been washed out the market place has to be developed afresh entirely from the scratch. At present only a few shops are functioning carrying on trading of goods. Most of the residents of the shelter have to depend on the market of Kamorta which is quite far from other group of Islands. As per information collected, Similar efforts would be made in other areas were Permanent Shelters are proposed to be set up. Therefore there is a huge scope for Micro Sector Enterprises in the tsunami effect area once the infrastructure is completely created. During the survey and discussions with the Revenue Authorities it was ascertained that 2007 is the target year by which the Permanent Shelter and all other necessary infrastructure would be completed.

Apart from the Tsunami Affected Areas there are pockets in where the natural calamity has not affected. This report also covers those areas. Plantation such Coconut, Rubber plantation and Fishing are the major activities besides trading form the major activities carried out in those areas. As such there is opportunity to establish few copra processing units in and around those areas. In addition, based on demand there is a scope to establish a bakery in different market places, Flour Mill, Sweets making, Poha, Murmura, Murukku, Mixture making and Broom Stick making units. The other agriculture related produces are negligible and not even enough for local consumption. As such there is hardly any scope to establish food processing industries like jam, jelly, pickle making etc. An illustrative list of micro enterprises area wise is given below –



IDENTIFICATION OF POTENTIAL MICRO

ENTERPRISES IN THE NON- FARM SECTOR

On the basis of the local demand skill and availability of resources the following areas have been identified as potential areas for setting up micro enterprises in the non-farm sector-

3. AGRO BASED & FOOD PROCESSING INDUSTRY-

There are 15 Villages in Car Nicobar of which all are Tribal Villages. Prior to Tsunami which occurred on 26th Dec 04 the economy of the village was dependent mostly on Copra Making and activities related to Agricultural Allied Activities such as piggery and subsistence level fishing. Coconut is essentially the most important and abundant resource available in Car Nicobar and is the main source of earning a livelihood for the tribal residing there. At present they are processing the raw coconut using traditional techniques and sell the finished product i.e. copra through Marketing Federation at Administered Prices or through Private Business as and when needed. There is a need to set up Improved Copra Dryer, at least one in each village. Besides Copra Making Units other demand based agro based units such as Bakery Unit, coconut Oil Making Unit, Brook Stick Making Units,

2. FOREST BASED INDUSTRY -

Car Nicobar has virtually no forest cover; there is no possibility of setting of Forest Based or Minor Forest Produced Based Enterprises in Car Nicobar. However there are many Coconut Trees, which have fallen or on the verge of falling due to inundation by sea level, these trees could be saved from decay and could be used for construction purposes as well as for making furniture for the daily use of the local population and if the quality is improve the same may be sold through Sagarika Emporium to the general public and tourists.

3. MARINE BASED INDUSTRY -

The island is endowed with Marine Resources. Fishing is being done by the Nicobaries at a subsistence level and the catch is meant for the their own consumption very little or no surplus of their catch comes to the market for economic purposes. The local demand of fish for the non tribal residing in Car Nicobar Island is supplied by importing frozen fish from Little Andaman and Port Blair. There is a need to promote improved techniques of fishing among the tribal of Car Nicobar so that they could make themselves economically more independent and rely less on coconuts. The Fisheries Dept has provided 95 fishing boats with out board engines. Besides the tribal have been given 103 Hodi (Traditional fishing boat) with fishing gears under 100% subsidy scheme. Ice Plants and Cold Storage at Tapoming Village, Car Nicobar is also being envisaged after acquisition of land. A 400Kg Deep Freezer has already been installed in Chucuka village for the benefit of the local fishermen. In view of this setting up of Mini Ice Plant, Mini Deep Freezer, Dry Fish Processing, Inter Island Trading of Fish etc has good scope.

4. <u>ANIMAL HUSBANDRY RELATED ACTIVITY -</u>

Apart from Agriculture & Fisheries there is good scope or establishment of allied activities like Poultry Farming, Piggery, Goatry, Dairy Farming etc. Presently the tribals are rearing pigs in a unscientific manner feeding them the deoiled copra. 





INVESTMENT OPPORTUNITIES

THRUST AREAS FOR INVESTMENT

On the basis of the local demand, skill and availability of resources, the following thrust areas have been identified for investment opportunities –

1. AGRO BASED & FOOD PROCESSING INDUSTRY-

The Andaman Nicobar Forest Plantation Development Corporation is the only Rubber plantation at Katchal which is now 35 years old. The average production of the Rubber material for last 5 years are as follows Sheet:

All the areas have been restored. Based on demand and availability of resources there is scope to establish Bakery, Flour Mill, Coir Rope, Rubber Sheet, Copra Processing, Broom Sticks etc.

2. FOREST BASED INDUSTRY -

The island is rich in forest resources like timber and other minor forest produce. However in view of the availability of Cane and Drift Wood in

the islands there exists scope for establishment of Cane Furniture, Cane Handicrafts, and Tribal Handicrafts & Drift Wood Items.

3. <u>FISHERIES BASED INDUSTRY -</u>

The island is endowed with rich Marine Resources. Most of the fishing communities are Tribes of Nancowry group of Islands. Now due to the intervention / assistance of NGO's like 'Aparajita', CARE and active participation of the Fisheries Dept the fishermen community have received approximately 58 motor driven boats till date. In order to store and supply the fish to nearby market the infrastructural support such as Cold Storage Facilities, Ice Plant, Deep Freezers are required to be developed. In view of this an Ice Plant, Deep Freezer, Dry Fish processing, Inter Island Trading of fish, Export of Crabs & Lobsters, Fresh Water Fish Rearing has good scope.

4. <u>ANIMAL HUSBANDRY RELATED ACTIVITY -</u>

Apart from Agriculture & Fisheries there is good scope for establishment of allied activities like Poultry Farming, Piggery, Goatry, Dairy Farming.

5. <u>RURAL ENGINEERING BASED INDUSTRY -</u>

The post Tsunami scenario in the islands offers scope for Light Engineering Work Shop such as Welding / Fabrication Units, Steel / Aluminum Fabrication, Black Smithy, Mgf. Of Agricultural Implements, Repairing & Servicing of Motor Vehicles (LMV/2&3 Wheelers), Repair of Domestic Appliances, Electronic repair shop etc.

6. <u>BUSINESS RELATED ACTIVITIES -</u>

Besides Fisheries & Agriculture, Small Trade & Business Related activities were severely affected due to Tsunami. The small trade and business activity which have good scope are Grocery, Stationery, General Stores, Cloth Shop, Fast food, Tailoring, Cobbler shop, Laundry shop, Barber Shop, Cycle repairing shop, Shoe Shop, Pharmacy etc..

PROSPECTS & FEASIBILITY OF ESTABLISHMENT OF MICRO ENTERPRISES

Due to the tsunami the coastal areas from Nancowry group of Islands has been affected and total of 1871 families (13391 Persons) have to be rehabilitated. In the process of rehabilitating the affected, initially the affected are being kept in Temporary Shelters located at different points in the Island. They shall latter be shifted to Permanent Shelter that are yet to be constructed.

At present only a few shops are functioning carrying on trading of goods. Most of the residents of the shelters have to depend on the market of Kamorta which is quite far from other group of Islands. Similar efforts would be made in other areas where Permanent Shelters are proposed to be set up. Therefore there is a huge scope for Micro Sector Enterprises in the Tsunami effect area once the infrastructure is completely created.

Apart from the Tsunami affected areas there are pockets in Nancowry group of Islands where the natural calamity has not affected. This report also covers those areas. Plantation crops such Coconut, Rubber and Fishing are some of the major activities besides trading form the main activities to be carried out in these areas. As such there is opportunity to establish few copra processing units in and around those areas. In addition, based on demand there is a scope to establish a bakery unit in each Islands, Flour Mill, Sweets making, Mixture making and Broom Stick making units. The other agriculture related produces are negligible and not even enough for local consumption. As such there is hardly any scope to establish food processing industries like Jam, Jelly, Pickle making etc. An illustrative list of micro enterprises area wise is given below:



INVESTMENT OPPORTUNITIES

BIRDS EYE VIEW ON THE MAJOR AREAS OF INVESTMENT

Considering the availability of raw materials and based on demand, few major areas have been identified as thrust areas which have investment opportunity as detailed below:

- Agro & Food based industry
- Forest based industry
- Fisheries based industry
- Animal husbandry related activities
- Rural Engineering industry
- Business related activities
- Service Industry

The details of these activities are as under:

> <u>AGRO BASED & FOOD PROCESSING INDUSTRY</u>

Prior to tsunami occurred on 26.12.2004, the economy of six (6) villages namely Govind Nagar, Joginder Nagar, Vijay nagar, Laxmi Nagar, Gandhi Nagar and Shastri Nagar which were inhabited mainly by the ex-servicemen settler families were dependent mostly on agriculture related activities. However out of these six villages five villages have already been washed out during the natural disaster occurred on 26.12.2004. The lone village namely Govind Nagar is also affected partially. As on date only about 100 Hectares of coconut plantation are available which produces 8, 00,000 (Eight lakh) nuts per annum. As such there is still some opportunity to establish few copra processing units in and around Campbell bay area. In addition, based on demand there is a scope to establish few bakery , power atta chakki, sweets making, masala making, poha, murmura, murukku, mixture making and broom making units at Campbell Bay. The other agriculture related produces are negligible and not even enough for local consumption. As such there is hardly any scope to establish food processing industries like jam, jelly, pickle making etc.

FOREST BASED INDUSTRY

Traditionally the entire Andaman & Nicobar Islands have the rich heritage of forest wealth, maximum of which is still found untapped. Like other islands the forest area of Campbell bay also offer a large quantity of cane and medicinal plants and therefore have good scope of establishment of few units in the line of activity in future. However since there is no traditional artisans, new skills will have to be developed by imparting practical training to the interested beneficiaries which will enable them to acquire required proficiency and the technique of production in the concerned trade.

FISHERIES BASED INDUSTRY

Fish is one of the most important resources available in the islands. About 126 families are maintaining their livelihood based on fishing activities. Due to tsunami, most of the families have lost their boats but department as well as NGOs (CRS) extended their co-operation and arrange to provide engine fitted boat to the victims. So far 40 such boats have been supplied to the affected fishermen and average of 4 MT fish per month are presently landed at Campbell Bay. In addition, 6 (six) Nos. of deep freezers have also been provided under the fisheries sector. The local market is capable to consume about 5 MT of fish per month. Therefore the catches which are in progress are required to meet the local demand.

It is anticipated that with in one or two months additional 30 boats will be provided to the fishermen and there will be substantial surplus in fish catch which need to be processed or sent to other islands for marketing. The nearby market is Car Nicobar Island. In order to store and supply the fishes to such market, adequate infrastructural support such as cold storage, ice plants, deep freezers need to be developed. In view of the requirement one ice plant, cold storage and deep freezing unit could be developed.

There is a potential of 1.00 lakh MT of Tuna fish in nearby areas of the islands based on that one fish processing unit could come up.

> <u>ANIMAL HUSBANDRY RELATED ACTIVITY</u>

Apart from agriculture and fisheries there is good scope to establish few animal husbandry related activities in the area such as poultry farming, piggery, goatery, dairy etc which will ultimately help in eradication of prevailing unemployment problem to some extent and also to improve economic stability of the islands at large.

RURAL ENGINEERING INDUSTRY

Presently the demand of furniture, fixture, dao, knife and other agricultural implements and construction related materials such as iron grills, gates etc are being met through supply of these items from Port Blair. Hence few units under carpentry and blacksmithy, fabrication of gates & grills, rolling shutters etc could be organized in the locality.

BUSINESS RELATED ACTIVITY

Apart from agriculture and fisheries, small trading and business related activities are the other severely tsunami affected areas of Campbell bay. These are the areas which could be adopted especially by the educated unemployed youths as self-employment ventures for their livelihood. Some of the business related activities which have good scope in the area are grocery, stationery, general store, tea stall cum snacks bar, ice cream parlor, fast food stall etc.

SERVICE INDUSTRY

From the past experience in the field of industrial activities it is revealed that service related activities are the biggest thrust area in the territory. As such like other places there is a good scope to establish few service related activities in and around Campbell Bay area like laundry, hair cutting saloon, beauty parlor, electrical wiring & domestic appliances, electronic repairing shop, repairing and servicing of 2, 3 and 4 wheelers, hiring of sound system like loud speaker, amplifier, mike etc, art board painting, cycle repairing shop, masonry work, motorized boat, dhaba/ restaurant, multi Gym, plying of auto rickshaw, tailoring and embroidery etc.

PROSPECT AND FEASIBILITY OF ESTABLISHMENT OF MICRO ENTERPRISES AT CAMPBELL BAY

<u>Appendix</u> <u>FACILITIES & INCENTIVES FOR INDUSTRIAL</u> <u>DEVELOPMENT IN A & N ISLANDS</u>.

The A & N Administration had introduced several incentives oriented schemes such as

- Industrial shed/plot in Industrial Estate at a normal lease rent of Rs.1.20 per Sq.ft. constructed shed.
- Interest free loan for promoter's contribution upto a maximum of Rs.50,000/- to SSI Units for marketing its product on mainland.
- Interest free loan for procurement of Generating set and in-house water harvesting equipment upto Rs.2.75 lakh for DG set and Rs.1.00 lakh for water harvesting equipments.
- 50% subsidy for stand by generating set and land development equipment upto a maximum of Rs.1.00 lakh.
- 50% subsidy on in-house water harvesting equipment upto a maximum of Rs.50,000/-.
- Inter subsidy to PMRY beneficiaries.

APART FROM THIS:

- There is no sales tax being levied.
- Octroi exemption on import of machinery
- 5 years tax holiday for SSI Units.

INCENTIVES PROPOSED IN THE 10TH FIVE YEAR PLAN FOR ATTRACTING NEW VENTURES/ INVESTMENT IN THE ISLAND:-

- Interest free composite loan of Rs.50.00 lakh for maximum for infrastructure development in IT, Tourism, Coir, Fisheries and Handicrafts related activities.
- 100% Transport Subsidy for export of handicrafts to Foreign countries (excluding banned sea-shell items).
- 50% Capital subsidy to Tourism, IT, Fisheries, Coconut and Arecanut related activities in rural areas.
- 50% price subsidy on procurement of raw materials such as padauk, cane & Bamboo.
- 75% of Capital Subsidy on establishment of Cyber-Café in rural areas.
- 50% Subsidy for procurement of copra dryer.
- Reimbursement of Training fee to entrepreneur for obtaining training in IT, Fisheries and Tourism discipline in India.
- Reimbursement of increase of price in respect of Padauk, Cane and Bamboo @50% of the amount of the price increase by Forest Department for the local SSI/ Handicrafts unit.
