CITIZEN'S CHARTER

THIS CHARTER IS THE STATEMENT OF THE MISSION AND COMMITMENTS OF
THE DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENT AND FORESTS, ANDAMAN AND
NICOBAR ADMINISTRATION

A. MISSION

We sincerely commit ourselves to the service of the people and long-term conservation of nature and natural resources of these islands. We also commit ourselves to totally safeguard the tropical forests of these islands in such a way that the conservation of biodiversity can be ensured along with sustained availability of goods and services from the forests.

B. SERVICES

The Forest Department has an active interface with the people and through this Charter the Department seeks to inform the public about the important areas of services.

1. Seedling distribution
2. Providing sawn timber to the wood based industries and public
3. Transit of timber
4. Registration of furniture units and renewal of licenses
5. Providing Non-Timber Forest Produce to public and small scale industrial units
6. Issue of entry permits to National Parks and Sanctuaries
7. Issue of permits to undertake research in Protected Areas and outside Protected Areas
8. Diversion of forest land for non-forestry use and application of Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980
9. Payment of compensation due to man and animal conflicts
10. Enforcement of Indian Forest Act (1927), Wildlife (Protection), Act (1972)

1. **Distribution of seedlings:** Seedlings of forestry, fruit bearing and ornamental species are distributed free of cost to the schools, Panchayats, municipality and public. Those who are genuinely interested in planting trees on their land, concerned DFOs may give the seedlings free of cost, subject to availability of seedlings. The public in need of seedlings should approach the nearest Range Officer /in-charge of the nursery from which they intend to procure the seedlings. Upto 50 nos. of seedlings can be procured from concerned Range Officer and above 50 from the concerned DFO who will make the seedlings available within 15 days from the date of application subject to availability of seedlings. Time frame for seedling distribution: 15 days from the date of receipt of application subject to availability of the seedlings.

2. **Providing timber/sawn timber to the wood based industries and public:** The Department has two Govt. Saw Mills which provide sawn timber and other mill products like saw dust, sawn fuel to general public and small scale industries. The Govt. Saw Mills also provides services like seasoning, planing, reverting, preservative treatment for such timbers.

Procedure and general guidelines for obtaining sawn timber from Govt. Saw Mills is at **Annexure-‘A’**.

The sale price of sawn timber and other miscellaneous mill products and treatment charges is at **Annexure-‘B’**.

Documents to be submitted with the application.

1. For permanent residents for construction/repair of own house
 - i. Copy of islander card
 - ii. Copy of ration card with full family details
 - iii. Copy of PAN card of all family members given in the ration card
 - iv. Record entry and sketch map of the land to be constructed or repaired
 - v. Copy of approved plan of house for new construction
 - vi. Category, size in running meter (rmt) of sawn timber required

2. For residents for making furniture items for his/her own personal use
 - i. Copy of islander card
 - ii. Copy of ration card with full family details
 - iii. Copy of PAN card

3. For Government Servants serving in the islands for a limited period for making personal items of limited use
 - i. Copy of ration card with full family details
 - ii. Copy of PAN card

4. For Govt. Contracted works
 - i. Award of contract works letter.
 - ii Estimate of the works specifying the quantity of timber required.

Time frame for providing sawn timber: 15 days from the receipt of complete application in prescribed format for the sizes available in stock

3. Transit of timber:

No forest produce can be transported within the limits of the Andaman & Nicobar Islands without obtaining valid transit pass from the Forest Office concerned. The prescribed fee for the transit pass is Rs.1/-. There is ban on export of timber from the islands to Mainland or to any other country. Transport of forest produce without valid Transit pass is liable for seizure of material and the vehicle/boat/cart. The Andaman & Nicobar Islands Forests Produce Transit Rules have been framed as below:

- i. Transit of all forest produce is to be done under the cover of valid transit pass.
- ii. Issue of transit pass for transport of ornamental wood viz Marbelwood, Chooi, Satinwood, Padauk, burr, buttress etc is strictly prohibited unless covered by permission of the PCCF.
- iii. Any person desirous of transporting timber or forest produce shall apply to DFO concerned.
- iv. Export of sawn timber is prohibited.
- v. Transit pass will be issued on all working days during working hours only.
- vi. Transit pass holder has to abide as per A&N Islands Forest Produce Transit rules

- vii. For movement of sawn timber within municipal limits of Port Blair, the challan /gate pass issued by saw mill is treated as transit pass for the purpose of these rules.
- viii. Transit pass to the applicant will normally be issued immediately if all government dues with respect to forest produce are paid to government. However, in case the DFO concerned feels that transit pass cannot be issued then he may inform the applicant in writing as to why transit pass cannot be issued within 15 days of the date when application was received by the concerned DFO.

Import of timber/forest produce: The applicant/firm has to apply in a prescribed form of Andaman & Nicobar Islands Forest Produce Transits Rules, 1966 (as amended upto 2004) before 15 days of the arrival of shipment to the Office of the Chief Conservator of Forests, A&N Islands. The prescribed format is at **Annexure-C**.

Timeframe for transit of timber: 15 days from the receipt of application.

Timeframe for issue of permission of import : 15 days

4. Issue of licences to wood based industries

As per the decision taken by the Government (pursuant to Order dated 12/12/1996 of Hon'ble Supreme Court in Writ Petition Civil No. 202/1995), no new saw mill licences are being issued.

The renewal of licenses of furniture units are carried out as per the provisions of the Andaman & Nicobar Islands Forest Produce Transits Rules and its amendments from time to time.

Timeframe for renewal of licenses: 15 days from the receipt of complete application and verification.

5. Providing Non-Timber Forest Produce to public and small scale industrial units:

- a) For collection of NTFP viz Ballies, Bamboo, cane, Thatching leaves, Firewood etc the applicant has to apply to Forest Officer concerned in whose jurisdiction he wanted to collect NTFP.
- b) On obtaining permission the applicant may pay prescribed amount.
- c) He may then collect the desired NTFP as allowed in the permit from specified area.
- d) Thereafter he may contact beat officer concerned to issue transit pass against the permit.

The rates of **NTFP** fixed by the Department is at **Annexure 'D**.

Timeframe for providing NTFP: 15 days from the receipt of complete application for bonafide applicants.

6. Issue of entry permits to National Parks and Sanctuaries:

Any person intending to enter in a Sanctuary for;

- a) Investigation or study
- b) Photography
- c) Scientific research
- d) Tourism

may follow the following procedure:

Procedure for issue of permit to persons entering in National Parks and Sanctuaries for purpose (a), (b) & (c):

A permit may be obtained from the Principal Chief Conservator of Forests (WL)-cum-Chief Wildlife Warden, Andaman & Nicobar Islands

Professional using cine camera for making TV documentary films shall execute an agreement provided in **Annexure-‘E’** with the State Government.

A permit shall be valid for the period specified therein.

The fee for operating a camera to be paid in advance shall be as follows:

a)	Professional photographers using still camera	Rs.200/- day and for feature film shooting Rs.3000/- per day
b)	Professional using any type of cine camera for the purpose of making TV or documentary films on Wildlife	Rs.3000/- per camera.

A fee of Rs.500/- per person per day in respect of Indian Citizen and Rs.2,000/- per person per day in respect of foreigners shall be charged for scuba diving.

Procedure for persons entering in National Parks and Sanctuaries for tourism purpose:

An application in the specified form provided in **Annexure-‘F’** to be submitted to the Chief Wildlife Warden/Deputy Conservator of Forests/Divisional Forest Officer/Assistant Conservator of Forests/Range Officer of their respective jurisdiction. On receipt of application and conduct of enquiry, the permission would be granted or rejected.

For the purpose of tourism, a permit shall be issued at the office or at the gate of Sanctuary or National Park on payment of fee.

Fee in respect of the permit granted shall be as follows:

1. Entry fee in Mahatma Gandhi Marine National Park and other island Sanctuary (in case of visitors not being students)

a	Adults (Indian)	Rs.50/- per person per day
b	Children (Age group of 5 to 12 years)	Rs. 25/-per person per day
c	Foreigners	Rs. 500/- per person per day
d	Foreign Yacht	Rs. 1,000/- per boat per day

2. For other Sanctuary and National Park

a	Adults (Indians)	Rs. 25/- per person per day
B	Children (Age group 5-12 years)	Rs.10/- per person per day
c	Foreigners	Rs.250/-per person per day

3. In case of students:-

a	Indians	Rs.5/- (Rupees five only per head per day)
b	Foreigners	Rs.10/- (Rupees ten only per head per day)

4. A child below five years shall be exempted from payment of the fee.

5. Vehicle:-

a	Light motor vehicle (car or jeep or a motor cycle including motor scooter and cycle)	Rs.20/- (Rupees twenty only) per day.
b	Heavy motor vehicle such as a bus or truck	Rs.50/- (Rupees fifty only) per day*.
c	Cycle and other vehicle manually operated	Rs.5/- (Rupees five only) per vehicle.

* rates inclusive of entrance fee of driver.

6. Boat permitted for plying for tourism purpose.

a	Boat carrying less than 10 persons	Rs. 10,000/- (Rupees ten thousand only) per annum*.
b	Boat carrying between 11-50 persons – Rs.50,000/- (Rupees fifty thousand only) per annum.	Rs.50,000/- (Rupees fifty thousand only) per annum *.
c	Boat carrying between 51 and above	Rs.100,000/- (Rupees one lakh only) per annum *.

* rates inclusive of entrance fee of rider.

Timeframe for issue of entry permits: 15 days for bonafide applicants from the date of application.

7. Issue of permits to undertake research in Protected Areas and outside Protected Areas:

To issue permits to various researchers for undertaking research in Protected Area and outside Protected Areas, the Research Advisory Committee (RAC) has been constituted. The composition of the committee is as follows:-

The Committee examines the proposals received from various Agencies/Project Proponents for carrying out research in Protected Area and non Protected Area and recommends to the Principal Chief Conservator of Forests for granting necessary permission to the Project Proponents subject to compliance to various Wildlife/Forestry Acts/Rules. The progress of the research project is to be intimated to the Department by the Project Proponents at regular intervals. The Project Proponents are required to share the outcome of the research project with the Department for better protection/management of forests and wildlife of these Islands.

Timeframe for issue of permission: 30 days

8. Diversion of forest land for non-forestry use and application of Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980:

As per the provisions of this Act, no forest area can be diverted for non- forestry purposes without prior approval of Ministry of Environment & Forests, New Delhi.

The procedure for diversion of forest land under the Act along with the procedure for obtaining clearance under CRZ and Environmental Impact Assessment is in **Annexure-'G'**.

9. Payment of compensation due to man and animal conflicts:

(a) Crop damage by Departmental elephants

- (i) In case of damage caused by department elephants to agricultural crops/horticultural crops/private property, the matter should be reported immediately to nearest Camp Office/Range Office.
- (ii) The Range Officer or his representative having territorial jurisdiction over the affected area will assess the damage along with a committee.
- (iii) The actual compensation admissible will be determined by the compensation assessment committee

(b) Loss of human life or injury leading to permanent disability by Wild animal

- i. All cases of loss of life/injury by wild animals should be reported to the nearest Range Officer.

- ii. The Range Officer will forward the same to the concerned Divisional office with all relevant documents
- iii. This would be verified by a committee and the amount of compensation shall be limited to the amount recommended by the committee.

The Guidelines prescribed by Andaman & Nicobar Administration for payment of cash compensation to the owner of the cattle/animals died due to wild animal attack along with the schedule detailing the amount of compensation is at **Annexure-‘H’**.

10 (a) Enforcement of Indian Forest Act (1927)

Acts prohibited in Reserved forests - any fresh clearing, setting of fire, trespassing, damage by negligence in felling any tree or cutting or dragging any timber, clear or break up any land for cultivation or any other purpose. The above acts are punishable with imprisonment, which may extend to 6 months, or fine, which may extend to Rs. 500/-, or with both.

Transit of timber in A&N Islands is regulated under A&N Islands Forest Produce and Transit Rules, 1966 framed under IFA, 1927. The penalty for contravention is imprisonment for a term which may extend to 6 months, or fine, which may extend to Rs. 500/-, or with both. Penalties may be double where the offence is committed after sunset and before sunrise, resistance to lawful authority or repeated offender.

Counterfeiting or defacing marks on trees and timber and for altering boundary marks- Whoever counterfeits upon any timber, mark on a standing tree used by forest officers, alters, defaces or destroys any boundary mark shall be punishable with imprisonment for a term which may extend to two years or with fine or with both.

Power to compound offences- Forest offences under the said Act can be compounded at the discretion of the competent forest officer and at the willingness of the offender by paying value of forest produce as assessed by the forest officer and/or compensation which may extend to Rs. 50/- or both.

(b) Enforcement of Forest Conservation Act:

Restriction on de-reservation of forest land for non-forest purpose: No forest land or any portion may be used for any Non forestry purpose, cleared of trees which have grown naturally in that land or portion.

Punishment for contravention of any of the provisions of this Act is with simple imprisonment for a period which may extend to 15 days.

(c) Enforcement of Wildlife (Protection), Act (1972).

Prohibition of Hunting: No person shall hunt any wild animal specified in the Schedule I,II,III,IV.

No person shall damage, uproot, willfully pick, collect, possess, sell, offer for sale any specified plant from any forest land.

Restriction on entry in Sanctuary: No person can enter in a Wild life Sanctuary other than a public servant on duty, person permitted by Chief Wild life Warden .The Chief Wild life Warden may grant any person a permit to enter in a sanctuary for investigation or study, photography .scientific research, tourism on payment of prescribed fee. Removal of any wildlife including Forest produce, causing fire, entry with weapon is prohibited.

The vehicles weapons, trap or tool involved in wildlife offence for poaching /Killing wild animal shall become State Government property and hence forfeited. As such public should note that they should not indulge in hunting of wild animals either inside forests or outside since the punishments under the Wildlife (Protection) Act are quite stringent .Hunting for the purpose of the Act includes trapping, snaring, poisoning (or even attempts) of wild animals or their young ones including eggs. Further acquiring, keeping in possession or transfer or causing any damage to any wildlife is an offence.

Rights of Schedule Tribes to be protected: The hunting rights conferred upon the scheduled tribes of Nicobar Islands in the Union Territory of A &N Islands is protected by Notification of the A&N Administration No.40/67/F,No.G635,Vol 111 dated the 28" April , 1967.

C. DUTIES OF PUBLIC IN GENERAL

It is the duty of every citizen to inform the nearest Forest Officer regarding fires in Government forest and also any information regarding commission of forest offence such as cutting of trees, killing of wild animals, etc.

All the Control rooms are functioning round the clock and any complaint regarding forest offence and animal rescue may be made on these telephone numbers.

D. COMPLAINTS AND GRIEVANCES

The Forest Department is duty bound to deliver courteous, prompt and transparent service to the public at all times. Instructions have been issued at all levels to achieve these. However, despite these, there can arise occasions when some service may not meet the requirement/expectations of public. Complaints can be made at the office of the Range Forest Officers, Divisional Forests Officers, the Deputy Conservator of Forests, Chief Conservator of Forests and the Principal Chief Conservator of Forests.

The Deputy Conservator of Forests (Planning & Monitoring) has been designated as Public Grievances Officer and he will hear the grievances from the public on all working days in his office.

ANNEXURE-‘A’

1) **PROCEDURE AND GENERAL GUIDELINES FOR THE PURCHASE OF SAWN TIMBER FROM GOVERNMENT SAW MILL AT CHATHAM**

- a) The request for purchase of sawn timber by Private individuals/SSI Units/Govt Contractors shall be entertained through the prescribed Indents issued after receiving application along with relevant documents.
- b) In case of private applicants who are applying for sawn timber specially Category-I A [Teak and Padauk] and Category IIA (Superior Hardwood) for the purpose of construction of house, all such applications should be submitted to the DCF(MD), Chatham through the concerned territorial range under whose jurisdiction the applicants worksite falls. The indent form for purchase of sawn timber for categories IA and IIA sawn timber will be issued from the Yard Section on Tuesdays from 0800hrs to 1000 hrs for general public. For SSI units and Govt. awarded contractors the indent forms for above category shall be issued on Wednesday from 0800hrs to 1000 hrs.
- c) After receiving applications at the office of the DCF (MD), Chatham, the applications shall be forwarded to the Forest Ranger, Yard, Chatham Saw Mill.
- d) Thereafter, the applicants whose applications is received at the Forest Ranger, Yard’s Office may approach the Forest Ranger (Yard) for collection of indent forms @ of Rs.5/- per indent for the respective categories of sawn timber as applied in the application.
- e) In case of private applicants who are applying for sawn timber specially category 1A (short length) IB (Second Class Padauk), Category II B Category III and Category IV for the purpose of construction of house or for any other purpose, all such applications can be submitted directly to the DCF (MD), Chatham. The indent form for purchase of sawn timber for categories IB, IIB, III and IV sawn timber can be collected from the Yard Section on all working days from 0800 hrs to 1000 hrs.
- f) Upon submitting the filled in indent forms at the Yard Office by the indenter, token numbers shall be issued to the indenters. The tentative date on which the required timber shall be issued to the indenter shall be displayed on the notice board as well as website. The indenter shall have to accept minimum of 20% to 30% of the total requirement of sawn timber in the form of short length.
- g) On the prescribed date allocated to the indenter for collecting sawn timber, he/she has to approach the Yard Office along with the token and present the same to the Forest Ranger, Yard. Upon which the Forest Ranger, yard shall issue token and allow the indenter to collect the sawn timber.
- h) The indenter has to arrange for labour on his own for the collection of sawn timber stacked in the respective sheds.

- i) The indent form will be closed after the measurement and bill will be prepared. The timber will be released on gate pass after obtaining the full payment by the Forest Ranger, Yard for transportation,
- j) For those category which has very limited stock rationing shall be done as per the availability of the stock.
- k) The indenter has to lift the sawn timber within 48 hours failing which ground charge shall be charged from the indenter as per the rate prescribed.
- l) The DCF (MD), Chatham reserves the right to order issuance of sawn timber in exceptional cases for meeting the emergent need arising from time to time.
- m) The customers may meet the DCF (MD) or AMM, Chatham during the office hours for redressal of their grievances, if any.

Procedure for purchase of sawn fuel, saw dust and other mill products:

- a) Sawn fuel, saw dust and other mill products are available for sale only after meeting the internal requirement of the mill. Municipal Council is given preference for firewood for crematorium and the forest workers and staff are given preference in case of sawn fuel.
- b) Customers are to submit the application on plain paper to the Assistant Mill Manager (AMM)/ Forest Ranger (Chatham) indicating the required quantity of sawn fuel in cords. The AMM will scrutinize the application required for sawn fuel after ascertaining its availability, inform the applicant about the date and quantity available for purchase. The applicant needs to make necessary payments to the Forest Ranger (Chatham) who will issue receipt for the same.
- c) The labour and vehicle required for collection of the sawn fuel has to be arranged by the buyer.
- d) Gate Pass in triplicate shall be issued by the Forest Ranger (Chatham).
- e) The procedure for purchase of saw dust and charcoal is the same as that of sawn fuel.

Procedure for purchase of handicraft items

- a) For the purchase of the Burr piece, prior permission of the Principal Chief Conservator of Forests (ANI) is required to be obtained which shall be issued only after ascertaining the availability of the same.
- b) The available stock of readymade handicraft items can be directly purchased from the sale counter on payment basis. Gate pass for the purchased items shall be issued at Sale Counter which shall be checked at the Main Gate.

2. PROCEDURE AND GENERAL GUIDELINES FOR THE PURCHASE OF SAWN TIMBER FROM GOVERNMENT SAW MILL AT BETAPUR

The computerised indents can be filled up by an indenter in Govt. Saw Mill, Betapur on the following days (Monday & Wednesday) from 6.00 A.M to 3.00 P.M. (If the above

day happens to be holiday then on the next working day during same timing the indent form will be issued).

General public placing indent should enclose self attested copies of valid identity card (ID card, Ration card, Aadhar Card), Khatuni Slip, License of the land (if for construction / repair of house).

If the procurement of the sawn timber is for the purpose of making furniture following details also to be given in indent form (i) Name of the furniture mart from where is the furniture is to be made (ii) or the indenter/private individual wants to make the furniture himself. Further, the SSI units / furniture mart should provide attested copies of hammer mark registration certificate and license issued by the Industries Department along with the indent form.

The indenter shall have to accept minimum of 40% of their total requirement of sawn timber in the form of short length. A date will be provided for collection and sale of timber. Indenter will have to collect the timber from Timber shed from available stock. Because of shortage of logs indenter may have to choose different sizes from indented size.

At present, indents are being received from General Public of North & Middle Andaman District only. Indents from General public having permanent address other than N&MA will not be entertained.

Since, form is computerised, indenter will have to come to Govt. Saw Mill, Betapur for filling of indent. No correspondence will be accepted otherwise.

The same procedure is applicable for sawn fuel, sawn dust and other products sold at Govt. Saw Mill, Betapur.

ANNEXURE-‘G’

Procedure for diversion of forest land under the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980:

- i) The Form for seeking prior approval for diversion of forest land under Section 2 of the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980 has been revised as per the Forest (Conservation) Rules, 2003. The User Agency has to apply in Part-I of form 'A' in case of fresh proposal and in Part-I of Forest 'B' in case renewal of lease. The concerned DFO has to submit the report in part-II. The report of the territorial conservator is required in Part-III. The Nodal officer has to submit his recommendation in Part-IV. The Secretary, Environment & Forests has to furnish recommendation in Part-V. Specimen of all the formats are appended herewith (Annexure 'A').
- ii) The Ministry has framed the time limit for processing the FCA proposal under Forests (Conservation) Amendment Rules, 2004. The salient point of the notification is reproduced herewith.
 - (a) Every User Agency who want to use any forest land for non- forestry shall make its proposal in the relevant Form appended to these circular, i.e Part-I of the Form 'A' for proposals seeking first time approval under the Act, and Part I of Form "B" for proposals seeking renewal of leases, where approval of the Central Government under the Act had already been obtained, to the Nodal Officer under FCA of the A&N Administration as the case may be along-with the requisite information and documents, complete in all respects.
 - (b) The User Agency shall endorse a copy of the proposal alongwith a copy of the receipt obtained from the Office of the Nodal Officer to the concerned Divisional Forest Officer or the Conservator of Forests Central, GOI, MOEF, SEZ, Chennai as well as the Monitoring Cell of the Forest Conservation Division of the MOEF, Paryavaran Bhawan, CGO Complex, Lodhi Road, New Delhi-110003.
- iii) After having received the proposal, the A&N Administration shall process and forward it to the Central Government within a period of two hundred and ten days of the receipt of the proposal including the transit period. The time period taken of each authority in A&N Administration for processing the proposal shall be as under:-
 - a) The Nodal Officer of A&N Administration after having received the proposal and on being satisfied that the proposal is complete in all respects and required prior approval under Section 2 of the Act, shall send the proposal to the concerned Divisional Forest Officer within a period of 10(ten) days of the receipt of the proposal. Provided that on the determination regarding completeness of the proposal or the expiry of ten days, whichever is earlier, the question of completeness or otherwise of the proposal shall not be raised.
 - b) If the Nodal Officer of A&N Administration finds that the proposal is incomplete, he shall return it within the period of ten days to the USER Agency and this time period shall not be counted for any future reference.

- c) The Concerned Divisional Forest Officer and the concerned Conservator of Forests shall examine the factual details and feasibility of the proposal, certify the maps, carry out site-inspection and enumeration of the trees and forward his findings in the Format specified in this regard to the Nodal Officer within a period of ninety days of the receipt of such proposal from him
 - d) The Nodal Officer, through the Principal Chief Conservator of Forests, shall forward the proposal to the A&N Administration, along-with his recommendations, within a period of thirty days of the receipt of such proposal from the DFO/ the CFs.
 - e) The A&N Administration shall forward the complete proposal along-with its recommendations, to the Regional Office or the Ministry of Environment and Forests, Paryavaran, Bhawan. CGO Complex, Lodhi Road, New Delhi-110003 as the case may be, in the specified.
- iv. Submission of EIA report by U.A is mandatory as per the Supreme Court's order dated 7.5.2002.
- v. The following documents are required to be enclosed by the user agency with the application form:-
- (a) Location map of the proposed site, duly signed by both User Agency and DFO
 - (b) Index, map is Survey of India Toposheet(1:50,000) or (1: 25, 000) duly signed by both U/A and DFO
 - (c) Joint site inspection report(User Agency and DFO)
 - (d) Lay out plan.
 - (e) Undertaking by U.A to pay cost of C.A
 - (f) Undertaking by U.A to pay royalty of timber
 - (g) Undertaking by U.A to pay N.P.V
 - (h) E.I.A Report
DGPS reading of forest land to be diverted and land identified for Compensatory Afforestation.

PROCEDURE PRESCRIBED FOR OBTAINING CLEARANCE UNDER CRZ NOTIFICATION 1991

For regulating development activities, the coastal stretches with 500 meters of High Tide Line to which landward side are classified into four categories, namely.

Category-I(CRZ-I)

- i) Area that are ecologically sensitive and important, such as national parks/marine parks, sanctuaries, reserve forest, wildlife habitats, mangroves, coral/coral reefs, areas close to breeding and spawning grounds of fish and other marine life, areas of outstanding natural beauty/historical/heritage areas., areas, areas rich in genetic diversity, areas likely to be inundated due to rise in sea level consequent upon global warming and such other areas as may be declared by the Central Government of the concerned authorities at the State Union Territory level from time to time.

Category-II (CRZ-II)

The areas that have already been developed upto or close to the Shoreline. For this purpose, "developed area" is referred to as that area within the municipal limits or in other legally designated urban areas which is already substantially built up and which have been provide with drainage and approach roads and other infrastructural facilities, such as water supply and sewerage ,mains.

Category-III (CRZ-III)

Area that are relatively undistributed and those which do not belong to either Category-1 or II. These will include coastal zone in the rural areas(developed and undeveloped) and also areas within Municipal Limits or in other legally designated **urban areas which are not substantially built up.**

Category-IV(CRZ-IV)

Coastal stretches in the Andaman and Nicobar, Lakshadweep and small Islands except those designated as CRZ-I, CRZ-II or CRZ-III

As per CRZ Notification as amended till date the development of coastal stretches upto 500 metres in CRZ-I areas and upto 200 metres in CRZ-III areas is strictly regulated. Such regulations area also applicable to CRZ-II areas on the seaward side of the existing to development such areas, prior clearance of Central Government is essential. For obtaining environmental clearance under CRZ Notification 1991, the user agency has to approve following line departments who are designated as enforcing agencies in their respective jurisdiction.

Forest areas-Divisional Forest Officer having territorial jurisdiction over the area.

Municipal Area (Port Blair)-Secretary, Municipal

Other revenue area-Deputy Commissioner of the respective district

Application along-with the details of the developmental activity with site and location maps should be submitted to Member Secretary, ANCoastal Zone Management Authority [APCCF (FC)] through respective enforcement agencies in whose jurisdiction the development activity is to be taken up. The Member Secretary, ANZMA shall scrutinize the proposal and submit it before the ANCoastal Zone Management Authority who may forward it with its recommendation to the Ministry of Environment & Forests on whose approval the work can be undertaken.

The project proponent is required to submit 11 sets of proposal in the prescribed applicable form for consideration by the A&N CZMA. On recommendation of the project 20 sets of questionnaire have to be sent by the project proponent to the National Coastal Zone Management Authority, New Delhi for approval for the project.

(a) In case of human life, on the basis of postmortem certificate issued by the concerned Medical Officer arid countersigned by the Medical Office In charge of the respective Primary Health Centre.Rs.3,00,000/-

(b) In case of permanent incapacitation, on the basis of the report of Medical Officer incharge of C.H.C./P.H.C or District Hospital, where specialists are not available or not competent to certify the percentage of disability, such cases have to be referred to the Medical Board of G.B. Pant Hospital, Port Blair for proper evaluation and certificate. Rs. 1,00,000/-

2. IN CASE OF INJURY:

(a) Grievous injury: Rs.33,000/-

(b) Minor injury: Cost of treatment

3. IN CASE OF LOSS OF CATTLE, DAMAGE TO HOUSE OR CROP OR OTHER PROPERTY:

(a) Loss of cattle: As per schedule attached.

(b) Damage to house or crop or other property: As per assessment of the damage decided by the committee prescribed for the purpose limited to Rs. 25000/-
